



Livestock & Craft Day Information

Tuesday 18th October – All Leisure Activities (not cooking or floral art) to be brought to school; take directly to your class. ALL poems, art and photography to be framed.

- Poem / prose twister written by the student (judged on content and presentation).
- Handmade card: birthday or greeting (computer generated, dried flowers, quilling).
- Art section: sketching, painting, water colours, digital art / graphic design
- Photography: taken by yourself with a description explaining why you chose to take the photo.
- Craft items: pottery, scrap booking etc.
- Fabric items, Maori / Pacifica arts and crafts.
- Models and lego.
- Farmland sculptures – please bring sculptures to the hall as soon as you get to school.

Wednesday 19th October – CRAFT DAY

- **Before school** all children are to take their muffins, biscuits and aqua jars, decorated cakes, Cooking Cup entries, large floral items, and veggie creations straight to the hall.
- Baking categories: All Cooking Cup entries will be judged on decoration and taste, the other cakes will be entered as either a decorated cake (class 1) or a cake to be tasted (class 2).
- Muffins will be judged on taste and texture (class 4). Cup-cakes will be judged on decoration only (class 5) Students will attach name when their class is called to the hall in Block 2.
- 3.15pm to 5.45pm craft, cooking, leisure activities will be open for public viewing in the school hall. Judging will be completed by 3.00pm.

NOTE: All items MUST be made by the students! Please collect all items from the hall after the Livestock activities have finished on Thursday 20th October.

Thursday 20th October – LIVESTOCK DAY

All children who have a calf, kid, lamb or dog are allowed to wear mufti clothes for Livestock Day (please dress sensibly).

- 8.30am All miscellaneous (small) pets and cats to the Music Room. 9.00am judging begins.
- 9 – 9.30am All calves, kids and lambs need to arrive through the bottom gate by the soccer field (Coronation Road entrance) and parking is available around the edge of the field.
- 9.30am Students bringing a dog arrive at school at 10am to avoid the dogs being tied up for too long. Dogs are to be secured to the fence by the lacrosse / hockey field (up by the Top Gate).
- 10.30am Calves, lambs, kids and dog judging begins. Top Team Programme begins. Small pets can be viewed.
- 12.30pm All dogs and small animals are to be picked up from school.
- 12.30pm Lunchtime for students. Lunch for judges at approx. 12.30pm.
- 1.40pm Finals for Top Team

All students not involved with an animal or involved with catering / organisation for Livestock Day on Thursday 20th October will take part in a Top Team Competition and will require their PE gear.

Lunches on Thursday 20th October

There will be a BBQ set up at school selling sausages in bread to students and visitors during the day on Thursday 20th. The school canteen will be open for morning tea only.
