

MERIT AND AWARDS PROGRAMME

This programme is offered to embed the school vision "Empowering Learners to Succeed" by providing students with opportunities to participate in academic, sporting, cultural, and civics roles and activities at Morrinsville Intermediate. Students will be able to earn Merit points through improvement, outstanding achievement and leadership roles.

Students must show commitment, a positive attitude, responsibility and reliability to be eligible for any award. It is not a matter of being selected for a team, group, or doing a "job" but how the student participates and demonstrates the qualities and values we are aiming for at Morrinsville Intermediate.

Points can be gained over the two years at Morrinsville Intermediate.

There are three levels to the programme:

- 1 Merit
- 2 Excellence
- 3 Honours

The programme reflects the opportunities available at Morrinsville Intermediate and is part of the school's ethos, culture and values.

APPLYING FOR MERIT OR EXCELLENCE AWARDS

- 1 All students are to enter points on their personal tracking sheet card throughout the term as events occur. Points are awarded for the highest achievement, rather than cumulative.
- 2 Teachers in charge of groups must add to our school-wide tracking document, the list of students who have earned points on completion of the activity and/or end of the term and notify teachers that this has happened via the student notices.
- 3 Activities must be entered on their tracking sheet as soon as they have completed the activity i.e. the term that they participate in (backdating may not be allowed; students need to be organised).
- 4 When a student believes from their tracking sheet that they have enough points to gain a Merit award they **double check this with their class teacher**, **and then submit it to their team leader**.
- 5 The team leader will confirm the merit or excellence with the student.
- 6 The Award is presented at assembly with the badge and a certificate.
- 7 A photograph will be displayed in the foyer.

APPLYING FOR HONOURS

- 1 A student can apply for Honours when they have achieved a minimum of **two excellences** and **one merit** in three different areas. For example: Excellence in Academics, Excellence in Cultural and Merit in Sport.
- 2 To qualify for Honours, a student **must also** exemplify our school motto "Kia U Ki Te Pai". The student will formally apply for Honours in writing to the Principal, stating why they believe they should be granted this award (they do not need to state everything they have done to achieve their Merits and Excellences) however they should include their personal attributes.
- 3 The Principal will decide, in consultation with the Senior Leadership team, whether the student is a worthy candidate for the award.
- 4 If successful, the student will be recognised at a special assembly, in which an Honours Badge is presented. The student's whanau are invited to attend.
- 5 The student's name will be placed on the Honours Board at the end of the year, and at that time they will receive an Honours Cup. Their name will remain on the Honours Board for future students to see.

APPLYING FOR DOUBLE HONOURS

From 2024 to be awarded Double Honours a student will start a new 'purple' card and have achieved **another** two excellences and one merit in addition to their initial Honours.

The student can carry over any **unused points** from their first cards, after receiving their Honours has been issued and have those points **signed off** by their classroom teacher.
