I trust you all had time during the school break to relax and unwind over either the Easter or Anzac Day holidays. We are all looking forward to another busy and exciting term ahead.... our production, entitled 1841, is underway and scheduled for performance in Week 9 (24th - 25th June). We are very lucky to have Miss Bailee Foulds and Mr Chris Gore who have collaborated to compose the script and we appreciate the extra time and effort that is required to 'make this happen'.

Well done to those students who came to school during the holiday break to begin preparation..... a great example of empowerment.

On the last day of Term 1 we held our ANZAC commemorative assembly.

We were lucky to have Paula Hendra, Captain Anne-Marie Leng, Officer Dave Fryer and Kerry Diamond from our local RSA join our assembly and share some of their insights and experiences in relation to their roles in the army. Our students gained a better appreciation, and empathy, for those who have served our country during a range of conflicts and made many sacrifices for the good of us all.

On ANZAC Day, our student executives attended the service at Howie Park; they did a great job of representing our school and laying a wreath on our behalf. We heard several addresses from dignitaries, including Mayor Adrienne Wilcock and the head boy and girl from Morrinsville College who spoke about the importance of commemorating the day and remembering its significance as part of our history. Lest we forget!

As part of our school value of Whakawhanaungatanga - doing the best for our community, and empathy (as part of our learner profile EMPOWERED), we are having a **NON-UNIFORM day to support our local Food Bank next Friday 9th May.** It would be appreciated if your child/ren could bring along at least one item of non-perishable food to donate to the Foodbank. Our student executives will be organising dropping the food off to the foodbank on our behalf. Thank you for your support.





As you are aware, we have an ongoing focus to improve attendance and engagement at school. Our targets include:

- 1. Improving our daily attendance rate as a whole school from to ≥91% in Term One we are achieving a daily attendance rate of 93% which is pleasing. Our next job is to maintain, or even build on this
- 2. Reducing unjustified attendances across the school we are currently having 1.6% unjustified attendance,
 - which is on the right track; reducing unnecessary absences will help reduce this further (these include taking long weekends, days off for birthdays, going shopping etc)
- Reducing the rate of absences on Mondays and/or Fridays by ≥ 5%. As you can see on the right, Fridays in Term 1 had the lowest attendance rate. I would love to see this improve further in Term 2

Staffing update:

We welcome Mrs Carla McKenzie to our team from the beginning of Term 2. Carla is predominantly working in Topehaehae One (T1) as Miss Lyndsay Oldham takes maternity leave from Week 4.

Carla is an experienced teacher and is familiar with our school having both of her children attend here, as well as having relieved here.

With a growing roll (373) Mrs Sally Armstrong is also being released an additional day in her role as Assistant Principal / SENCO.

We wish Miss Oldham all the very best for the remainder of her time with us and for the safe arrival of her baby.

Structured Curriculum:

As you will have heard, all schools are required to deliver a structured approach to literacy and mathematics. This includes one hour of explicit teaching in Reading, Writing and Mathematics.

Our literacy programme consists of word work (The Code) that is founded largely on spelling, as well as the use of Writers Toolbox. In addition to this teachers will be teaching other literacy concepts. There is some writing being completed online, and some offline. We aim to have a balanced approach.

In Mathematics we have already implemented a school-wide maintenance programme (approximately 15 minutes per day) along with Maths Whizz. Maths Whizz is supplementary to explicit teaching which in Term 2 will be largely based on PR1ME Mathematics. This is the resource that we elected to use which was provided by the government. We have used Term 1 to identify which book students will be working from to ensure they can be both challenged yet able to access the learning. Teachers have received professional development in the use of PR1ME in Term 1 and have worked hard to ensure they're ready to start using PR1ME Maths as part of their programme from the start of this term.

There may be some 'kinks in the road' initially, but please understand teachers are navigating many changes mandated by the government and are doing their best to deliver an effective programme that meets the needs of all ākonga (learners). If you have any questions about the learning programme please ensure you speak to the classroom teacher first and foremost.

Emergency Preparedness: Lockdown Drill

Health and safety are of utmost importance. As a school, we work with Harrison Tew, a company who specialises in emergency preparedness.

We are due for an audit on our practice. This includes conducting a **lockdown drill** to ensure everyone understands the importance of being prepared in the case of an emergency as well as ensuring we conduct our drills with vigilance. The drill / practice will happen in Week 2; I will be outlining the process with students at this week's assembly.



LETTER FOR PARENTS BEFORE A LOCKDOWN EXERCISE

Dear Parents.

As part of keeping our school safe we need to be able to respond safely and quickly to a range of emergency situations.

We work alongside an independent company, Harrison Tew[®], who specialises in emergency management planning for schools, whose procedures have been successfully implemented in hundreds of schools throughout New Zealand.

As part of maintaining our emergency procedures in our school, specialised training is being conducted with our senior leadership and staff by Harrison Tew[®].

The students will also receive information on how to respond in an emergency at assembly tomorrow, and from their teacher again next week.

We will then be conducting a lockdown exercise under the guidance and support of Harrison Tew[®].

During the exercise you will receive a notification from the school, so it is important that your emergency contact details are up to date and correct. The notification will emphasise that this is an exercise/practice and will explain that all updated information will then be posted on the school website.

In a genuine incident, should you become aware of a lockdown or evacuation at the school, can I please ask that you do not attend the school or phone the school, as we will not be able to respond. Your presence or contact may make it more difficult for us or the emergency services to manage a situation.

The Ministry of Education developed an enrolment scheme for Morrinsville Intermediate School which was implemented last year. The Board invites applications from parents of out of zone students who wish to enrol their children at Morrinsville Intermediate School for the 2025 mid-year intake. Once the school has received your out of zone pre-enrolment you will be sent a Ballot Registration. The deadline for receipt of applications for out of zone places is Monday 12th May, 9.00am.

The Board has determined that five places will be available for out of zone students in June 2025. If the number of out of zone applications exceeds the number of places available, students will be selected by ballot. If a ballot is required, it will be held on Monday 12th May 2025, at 10.00am.
